MINUTES OF THE LAWNDALE CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING April 6, 2020

Consistent with Executive Orders No.-25-20 and No. N-29-20 from the Executive Department of the State of California and the Los Angeles County Health Official's "Safer at Home" Order, this City Council meeting was not physically open to the public as City Councilmembers teleconferenced into the meeting via WebEx Communications.

A. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Mayor Pullen-Miles called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. in the City Hall council chamber, 14717 Burin Avenue, Lawndale, California.

Captain Allen summarized recent law enforcement activities.

E. COMMENTS FROM COUNCIL

No comments were provided.

F. CONSENT CALENDAR

1. <u>Motion to read by title only and waive further reading of all ordinances listed on the Agenda</u>

Recommendation: that the City Council approve.

2. <u>Consideration of Claims Against the City</u>

Recommendation: that the City Council reject the claim filed by Francisco J. Lopez and instruct staff to process the appropriate correspondence to the claimant.

Recommendation: that the City Council adopts Resolution No. CC-2004-018, authorizing the payment of certain claims and demands in the amount of \$648,779.99.

A motion by Councilmember Reid to approve the consent calendar was seconded by Councilmember Kearney and carried by a vote of 5-0.

G. <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

5. <u>Authorizing Application For and Receipt of Local Early Action Planning Grant Funding</u>

Recommendation: that the City Council (a) that the consideration of Resolution CC-2004-017 is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines; and (b) adopt Resolution No. CC-2004-017 authorizing staff to submit an application for grant funding from the Local Early Action Planning Grant Program.

Community Development Director Sean Moore reported on the proposed application for grant funding from the Local Early Action Planning Grant Program.

A motion by Councilmember Osborne to approve the Authorizing Application For and Receipt of Local Early Action Planning Grant Funding with the amendment to have the Community Development Director inserted to authorize the application was seconded by Councilmember Reid and carried by a vote of 5-0.

6. <u>Urgency Ordinance Prohibiting Eviction during the COVID-19 Pandemic</u>

Recommendation: that the City Council consider whether to adopt Urgency Ordinance 1170-20, that prohibits residential and commercial evictions resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, effective immediately.

City Attorney Tiffany Israel reported on the Urgency Ordinance Prohibiting Eviction during the COVID-19 Pandemic

<u>Public Comment</u> (Read aloud by Assistant City Clerk Matthew Ceballos)

Sean Waxman, Resident and Business owner, provided an e-comment in favor of approving the ordinance.

A dialogue ensued between Council about the noticing requirement from tenant to landlord.

A motion by Councilmember Kearney to approve the Urgency Ordinance Prohibiting Eviction during the COVID-19 Pandemic was seconded by Mayor Pullen-Miles and carried by a vote of 5-0, following City Attorney Israel's reading of the title of Urgency Ordinance No. 1170-20.

7. <u>Further Modifications to City Operations and Related Issues Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic</u>

Recommendation: that the City Council consider and approve (a) Ratification of staff's decision to temporarily suspend parking enforcement for street sweeping, and to dismiss street sweeping related parking citations issued on March 16-17, 2020; (b) Cancellation of the April 25, 2020 Community Bike Ride and Youth Day Parade/Spring Extravaganza; (c) Form a City Council budget subcommittee to work with staff in reviewing revenue and expenditure projections and to develop recommendations for City Council consideration; and (d) Provide direction to staff regarding Transient Occupancy Tax collection, and penalties and interest measures.

City Manager Kevin M. Chun reported on the Further Modifications to City Operations and Related Issues Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, such as: parking enforcement; public events; financial consideration; and the transient occupancy tax.

Public Comment (Read aloud by Assistant City Clerk Matthew Ceballos)

Randall Abram, Resident, provided an e-comment in favor of approving further modifications to city operations and related issues due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

City Manager Kevin M. Chun added an item for ratification, (e) to draft a letter of support to deferral of the L.A. County Sherriff Department rate increase.

A dialogue ensued between the City Council about future events and the financial outlook of the City during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mayor Pullen-Miles nominated Councilmember Kearney and Councilmember Reid to be on a budget sub-committee.

A lengthy dialogue ensued between the City Council and staff regarding the potential waiver of transient occupancy tax, collection of the transient occupancy tax, and other remedies to assist local hotels and motels during the COVID-19 pandemic.

A motion by Councilmember Osborne to approve the ratification of staffs decision to temporarily suspend parking enforcement for street sweeping, and to dismiss street sweeping related parking citations issued on March 16-17, 2020; the cancellation of the April 25, 2020 Community Bike Ride and Youth Day Parade/Spring Extravaganza; form a City Council budget subcommittee, with Councilmember Kearney and Councilmember Reid, to work with staff in reviewing revenue and expenditure projections and to develop recommendations for City Council consideration; Transient Occupancy Tax collection, and penalties and interest measures would be done pursuant to the Lawndale Municipal Code; and draft a letter of support of a deferral of the L.A. County Sherriff Department rate increase, was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Bernadette Suarez and carried by a vote of 5-0.
