# 8. South Bay Workforce Investment Board (SBWIB) Appointment to the Lawndale Business Private Sector Seat

Recommendation: that the City Council (a) review the submitted information from Mr. Roderick D. Edison, as supported by the SBWIB; (b) re-affirm the SBWIB 's nomination of Mr. Roderick D. Edison as the City of Lawndale' s SBWIB representative on the Business Private Sector seat, filling the remaining term from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2024, and direct staff to provide that name to the SBWIB for the Inglewood Chamber of Commerce's final approval; <u>or</u> (c) Direct staff to open up nominations for additional applications including advertising the opening on the City's website and social media platforms; and (d) bring the nomination applications to an upcoming City Council

meeting and provide direction to staff to provide a name to the SBWIB for the Inglewood Chamber of Commerce's final approval, to fill the upcoming vacancy on the City of Lawndale's SBWIB Business Private Sector seat, filling the remaining term of July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2024.

Councilmember Cuevas inquired if the appointed representative had to reside in Lawndale or have a business in Lawndale. Mr. Pullen-Miles responded accordingly.

A motion by Councilmember Suarez to re-affirm the South Bay Workforce Investment Board's (SBWIB) nomination of Mr. Roderick D. Edison as the City of Lawndale's SBWIB representative on the Business Private Sector seat, filling the remaining term from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2024, was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Kearney and carried by a vote of 5-0.

### 9. Award of Citywide Information Technology Services Contract

Randall Abram, Resident, spoke in support of the administrative citations for illegal fireworks. Mr. Abram added the city should have a program with local fire department, law enforcement and residents to report any person storing illegal fireworks.

Due to technical difficulties the Mayor recommended to table the item until the technical issues could be resolved. There being no objection, Item H10 was tabled until the technical issue was resolved and would be taken immediately after for Council consideration.

City Manager Kevin Chun announced that the COVID-19 vaccination clinic with Providence Little Company of Mary provided 231 Moderna vaccines on Friday, April 16, 2021 and will return Friday, May 14, 2021 with the second dose. The City Manager went on to report on the City Council Park Subcommittee meeting with Lawndale Elementary School District next week and asked the Council to supply questions and comments.

Technical issues were resolved and Item H10 was brought back for Council discussion.
